Gaspar Museum, an intimate artistic experience in a green setting

The **Gaspar Museum** invites visitors to enjoy a rare and almost confidential moment. Nestled within a **lush park**, a fully renovated **19th-century bourgeois house** opens its doors to present the art and history of the **Arlon region** in a different way. Here, the motto takes on its full meaning: **the intimacy of a home, the richness of a museum**. You enter as if visiting someone's house, discover it as a cultural space, and leave with the feeling of having experienced something truly special.

Even before entering, the calm of the park sets the tone. The noise fades away, greenery surrounds the house, and visitors prepare for a **human-scale visit**, ideal for families as well as for those seeking a meaningful and peaceful cultural moment.

A restored house immersed in the Belle Époque

The building, **restored to its original state**, preserves all the charm of the **Belle Époque**. The volumes, architectural details and intimate atmosphere give the visit a natural rhythm, without haste. Each room seems to tell a story, each space invites visitors to pause, observe and feel.

This proximity creates a special relationship with the artworks and stories presented. You do not simply pass through anonymous galleries: you **inhabit the place for the duration of the visit**, carried by the feeling of being welcomed rather than guided.

Two brothers, two perspectives, one shared passion

The visit immerses visitors in the world of **two artist brothers**, important figures in the local cultural life. **Jean Gaspar**, a renowned animal sculptor, is highlighted for the finesse and strength of his work. His career is particularly striking, notably because he **taught Queen Elisabeth**, a testament to the excellence and recognition of his art.

Alongside him stands **Charles Gaspar**, photographer, patron and **benefactor of the city**, who represents another facet of artistic commitment. His vision, social engagement and attachment to the region bring additional depth to the visit. Together, they offer a sensitive and complementary perspective on Belgian art and its local roots.

Temporary exhibitions between discoveries and hidden treasures

The Gaspar Museum stands out for its **unique temporary exhibitions**, carefully renewed over time. They highlight **lesser-known treasures of Belgian art**, inviting visitors to explore with curiosity and surprise. Each exhibition is designed to dialogue with the setting, respecting the atmosphere of the house while enriching the experience without overwhelming it.

This programme encourages visitors to return and rediscover the house from a new perspective as the seasons change. The museum remains vibrant, attentive and evolving while preserving its intimate identity.

A human-scale museum open to families

Often described as **ideal for families**, the Gaspar Museum welcomes children naturally and without constraint. The spaces, the duration of the visit and the overall atmosphere allow for a relaxed discovery where both young and old easily find their place. Visitors exchange impressions, comment and share their thoughts in a setting that never feels intimidating or rushed.

This accessibility, combined with the quality of the content, makes the museum appreciated both by local residents and by visitors seeking a different kind of cultural experience.

A suspended moment between art and nature

The Gaspar Museum offers something many people seek but rarely find: **a calm, rich and authentic moment** in a unique environment where art meets nature. The park extends the experience, inviting visitors to stroll, reflect and simply enjoy being there.
